#### **RESULTS OF ANNUAL ELECTION OF LAW SOCIETY COUNCIL 2023**

## **Senior Category**

There are 3 candidates for 4 places in the Senior Category. The candidates are Sam Hui Min Lisa, Chia Soo Michael and Lam Kuet Keng. As there are fewer candidates than the number of places, there is no election for the Senior Category this year. Under section 53(1) of the Legal Profession Act, Sam Hui Min Lisa, Chia Soo Michael and Lam Kuet Keng are deemed to be elected.

Sam Hui Min Lisa and Chia Soo Michael are current Council members and Lam Kuet Keng was a former Council member.

## **Middle Category**

There are 2 candidates running for 1 place in the Middle Category. The 2 candidates are, in no particular order, Gregory Xu Weicheng and Sui Yi Siong (Xu Yixiong).

The results of the ballot held on Tuesday, 25 October 2022 are as follows:

Name of Candidate	Number of Votes
1) Gregory Xu Weicheng	811
2) Sui Yi Siong (Xu Yixiong)	613

Under section 51 of the Legal Profession Act, the elected candidate in the Middle Category is Gregory Xu Weicheng.

Gregory Xu Weicheng will be a new addition to Council.

# **Junior Category**

There are 3 candidates running for 2 places in the Junior Category. The 3 candidates are, in no particular order, Andrew Chua Ruiming, Ashvin Hariharan and Eva Teh Jing Hui.

The results of the ballot held on Tuesday, 25 October 2022 are as follows:

Name of Candidate	Number of Votes
1) Andrew Chua Ruiming	917
2) Ashvin Hariharan	682
3) Eva Teh Jing Hui	1085

Under section 51 of the Legal Profession Act, the elected candidates in the Junior Category are, in no particular order, Andrew Chua Ruiming and Eva Teh Jing Hui.

Andrew Chua Ruiming is currently a Council member and Eva Teh Jing Hui will be a new addition to Council.
